# **News in Brief**

Storking Lane Amenity Land – some of you will already have seen that we've added an additional gated access to the amenity land from Storking Lane, creating an access point closer to the village boundary. We've also replaced an original wooden gate with a metal one. Because all three access gates are now metal, they have been fitted with makeshift noise reducing measures. Please close the gates quietly so that they reduce the impact on neighbouring properties. Thank you.



In addition, about 40 meters of fencing along the beck will be replaced in due course. The Internal Drainage Board has offered to remove the briar and old fence, but they need to wait until after the bird nesting season. If you or anyone you know would like to quote for the replacement of post and rail fencing, we would welcome your contact.

**Speed Indicator Device** – we are aware of teething issues with the SID on Ling Lane. We will work to resolve these as soon as possible.

Despite a plea in the Newsletter, we have been unable to find anyone to clean the street furniture and bus shelters. We will now reach out to the Community Payback Scheme.

Children's Book Swap – we are using funds from the *Wilberfoss Quarry Fund* to build a dedicated children's book swap in the porch at Wilberfoss Community Centre. It will complement the well-used one that exists already. If you or anyone you know would like to quote for the work to build the cabinet, we would welcome your contact.

**New Councillors -** We are hopeful of recruiting two new Councillors at July's Parish Council meeting. The applications are in, but holiday commitments prevented the applicants from attending our meeting in June.

We still have one vacancy remaining. If you're interested in contributing to Wilberfoss village life, we'd love to hear from you. Alternatively, pop along to one of our open meetings. They take place every third Thursday in the month at the Community Centre.

Following an Asda grant, we are pleased to announce that 120 new laurel hedge plants are being planted throughout the playing fields site - around the @ Pavilion Bar and Bistro patio, the far side behind the football pitches and one part of the lane that used to be fenced before getting damaged and used as a walkway aswell as 2 new picnic benches ordered for the children's play area.

Agencies they work with include: housing support officers, schools, children's centres, health visitors, social services and some local charities.

### 1. Get in touch with the foodbank.

If you call or email the foodbank they can talk through your situation and put you in touch with a relevant local agency.

### 2. Arrange a visit to the referral agency.

They will discuss your situation and supply you with a foodbank voucher where appropriate.

### 3. Bring your foodbank voucher to your nearest foodbank centre.


