# **News in Brief**

We said farewell to Lynda Hoyle this month. Lynda has been a dedicated Parish Councillor since 2020 and Vice Chair for several years. We wish you well for the future Lynda. Gemma Gibbs is now the only female Parish Councillor and with two vacancies, and soon to be a third following Lynda's resignation, we would welcome an increase in female representation.

The Annual Parish Council meeting saw the re-election of Richard Rains as Chair and the appointment of Colin Veitch as Vice-Chair. At this year's Annual Parish Meeting several groups in the village shared their annual reports with us. Speed Indicator Device – by the time the Newsletter is published the SID should be in situ. It will move between 3 locations over the course of a year. This project will be funded by the 2025 allocation of the Quarry Fund, a fund that was set up by Wilbefoss Quarry Landfill & Recycling Facility and supports the parishes of Wilberfoss and Newton upon Derwent.







There have been two potential pollution incidents recently when it was suspected that illegal substances may have been burned. Both instances impacted the village – the first leaving a residue on surfaces and the second seeing plumes of black smoke over the beck. Pollution issues should be reported to East Riding of Yorkshire Council through the email address

pollution.control@easriding.gov.uk.

Pollution Control do not operate an emergency call out so well gathered, accurate evidence is essential for prosecution. Reports must include the precise location, details of how long the issue has been going on, what impact it is having on those providing the evidence. If it's safe to do so, photo/video evidence of the offence from a nearby location will help

Involving children in this would be wonderful- they love the colour and watching the bees and butterflies - a natural nature lesson and outdoor activity to do together, perhaps?



# Safeguarding - the action the Church takes to promote a safer culture within the Church.

The Ministry Team and all front-line volunteers have been on training courses regarding the important issue of safeguarding, following the relevant national legislation and guidance. The front-line volunteers include those who welcome worshippers and distribute hymn books and liturgy, read the lessons, lead the intersessions, invite you to take communion or to come forward for a blessing. All Church led activities have at least one person who has their safeguarding certification and has been cleared by the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS).

### Food Bank - How it Works

If you or someone you know needs help from the foodbank there are a few simple steps to follow.

### The most important step is to get a foodbank voucher.

Please call for free to talk confidentially to a trained Citizens Advice adviser on: **0808 208 2138** (open Monday to Friday, 9am-5pm, closed on public holidays). Alternatively for help in accessing a voucher, you can also call Citizens Advice York on 03 444 111 444.

In order to provide the most appropriate help for the circumstances of your situation, the foodbank works with local agencies. If they feel you are struggling to put food on the table, they will issue you with a foodbank voucher. The local agency can also help provide long term support if needed to help address problems which may be causing you concern or have led to a challenging situation. Agencies they work with include: Citizens Advice, housing support officers, schools, children's centres, health visitors, social services and some local charities.

### 1. Get in touch with the foodbank.

If you call or email the foodbank they can talk through your situation and put you in touch with a relevant local agency.



### 2. Arrange a visit to the referral agency.

They will discuss your situation and supply you with a foodbank voucher where appropriate.

### 3. Bring your foodbank voucher to your nearest foodbank centre.

You can find a list of the local centres and opening times at the web address below. When you arrive, you will be welcomed with a tea or coffee and the trained volunteers will chat with you about anything you would find helpful. They will also discuss any dietary needs you may have and exchange your foodbank voucher for a parcel of three days of emergency food. They will also help to support you in any other ways that they can. Most foodbank centres offer a café style environment and their aim is to provide support to prevent a crisis.

The following list contains items desperately needed:

Breakfast cereal (not porridge)

Jars of jam

Toilet rolls

Deodorants

Washing up liquid Strong carrier bags, e.g. bags for life.

These are items which are running low:

Fruit juice (not chilled) Powdered Milk

UHT Milk Sugar

Tinned rice pudding Tinned custard Tinned Fruit.


