## **News in Brief**

The Parish Plan in 2020 identified that speeding and parking were the main concerns of residents. We have spent 2 years appealed to East Riding of Yorkshire Council to install traffic calming measures. We have at last made a breakthrough! Three sites have been approved by East Riding of Yorkshire Council (lighting columns 3 and 19 on Main Street and one on Ling Lane) and a data capture Speed Indicator Device will be purchased using funds from the 2025-2026 Quarry Fund allocation. The unit will be moved between the 3 sites over each 12-month period. Data capture will enable us to monitor the number of speeding vehicles and identify the streets most impacted.

Following a request to ERYC Highways, it has been confirmed that an engineer will visit Hawthorn Drive to assess it for surface dressing.

Following residents' concerns about broken fencing on the Amenity Land off Storking Lane and having been advised that its replacement will be low priority for East Riding of Yorkshire Council, precept monies will be used. There is a requirement to seek 3 quotes. Please bear with us.

Due to the increasing smell of dog foul from the bin at the bottom of Field Head, which impacts those who live there, we will trial the blocking of 3 openings so that the bin can only be access from the front.

Following residents' concerns, an engineer will visit the snicket on Middle Street to assess it for safety. We have requested Parish Council presence at the meeting.



### Wilberfoss Village Bus Service

Adequacy and Safety of the Wilberfoss Village Bus Service

Quick comfortable convenient Market Weighton to York every 20 mins that's the advert on the bus timetable. Not if you live in Wilberfoss and have to cross the A1079 to stand in a noisy shelter close to the road with cars and lorries going by at speed. The A1079 is a dangerous road to cross as a pedestrian how long will it be before we have a fatal accident? What will it take to recover our village bus service?

The decline in the village bus service has happened slowly down the years. A new bus timetable with just a small change here or there. The main change came with the introduction of the X46 as a fast bus to York. The slow introduction of the bus service along the main road and then a bus shelter placed on the opposite side of the main road with no thought of how people with children or elderly residents would cross the A1079. Or how teenagers catching the bus later in the day to school would feel standing out on the main road. If you have stood at the bus stop you would know how noisy it is with cars going past at speed and car fumes are not a healthy way to start your day.

We came to Wilberfoss 40 years ago. A bus came through our village every 20 mins. A frequent bus service allowed me to attend university with a young family and after that allowed me to work in York. I was given that freedom through a bus service, a frequent bus service that came through our village.

Our village has doubled in size over the last four decades every time new houses are introduced we are told we will have better services. We are now lucky if we have a bus an hour. If a bus breaks down or as happened last year a bus cancelled through a shortage of drivers, I waited an hour in Pocklington for the X47. A lady went over to the bus station and asked a driver where the X47 was and informed - sorry no bus shortage of drivers, don't worry you have the X46 service. I had no choice and used the X46....NEVER AGAIN - the A1079 was busy as usual and the only way to cross as a pedestrian was to use the refuge in the middle of the road. I was stranded only a short while but it seemed an age as lorries and cars flew by me in both directions.

We are told we have a bus service every 20 mins - the first bus to come through our village from York since the introduction of the X45 service is 9.43 in the morning. I myself and the Parish Council have been in touch to complain about the decline in our bus service. The Bus Company say that coming through our village will reduce the bus service and yet the X45 goes through Dunnington. Are we less important than Market Weighton and Dunnington? The Bus Company think we are happy with the bus service. Unless residents complain our village bus service will continue to decline.






