News in Brief

Greener Pocklington will be installing a Bug Hotel on the amenity land off Storking Lane. They're asking for support from residents, so if you have any pinecones, teasels, bamboo canes, small logs, corrugated cardboard, straw, twigs, bricks or tiles, please take them to the garden at the bottom of the amenity land on the 4th October, where the team will be on site from 10.00 am. They will be delighted for community involvement in building the Hotel. You can email Tony and the team on greenerpock@gmail.com.



Litter Bin, Storking Lane – East Riding of Yorkshire Council have been quick to respond to our request for a litter bin and have already installed it. Please use it to keep the amenity land litter free for everyone's use.

Community Payback team – we want to say a huge thank you to the team from East Riding. They have committed to the Parish Council and community of Wilberfoss on an ongoing basis.

Having already cleaned the street furniture, painted the bridge on the A1079 and removed overgrown vegetation that was obstructing access, they're looking for further projects. We've asked them to remove and replace the fence on the amenity land and we're drawing up a list of tasks that will benefit the community.

Snicket, Middle Street. Because the snicket is a concealed entrance onto Middle Street, and vehicles cross it to access Middlecroft, we're exploring safety options for the end of the snicket. This may involve the installation of a safety barrier. If you have any comments or alternative suggestions, please email us.

Bus Shelter, Main Street – Subject to a suitability assessment, we have secured funding from East Riding of Yorkshire Council for the installation of a bus shelter. Our proposal would be to install a shelter at the bus stop on Main Street, adjacent to the grass garden at the Butcher's shop. Public consultation is required, but we know from the positive comments to the shelter we installed on Main Street last year, it will be a welcome addition for passengers and school children.

Changes to the X45, X46 and X47 bus services: To improve punctuality buses will run every 15 minutes between Pocklington and York.

Information

The UK government is testing the Emergency Alerts system on **Sunday 7 September 2025 at 3pm**.

Your mobile phone or tablet will vibrate and make a loud siren-like sound, even if it's set on silent. The alert message will confirm this is a test and that you do not need to take any further action.

Regular testing ensures the system is functioning correctly, should it need to be used in a life-threatening emergency. Find out more at *gov.uk/alerts*.

You can opt out of the Emergency Alerts, including the national test, but you should keep them switched on for your own safety.

Emergency Alerts will warn you via your mobile or tablet if there's a lifethreatening emergency nearby. Only the government and the emergency services are able to send them.

There are simple and effective steps we can all take to be more prepared for an emergency. Visit *gov.uk/prepare* for advice on how you can prepare.


