# News in Brief

We welcome Anna Edwards as our newest Councillor, and we will look forward to seeing what Anna brings to the role. We have one remaining vacancy - *No politics, no special qualifications, just a willingness to listen, speak up and help shape where you live.* Interested? Drop the Clerk a line to have an informal, no obligation, chat.

**Have you seen it?** At no cost to the community, because the project was fully funded through the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Transportation Services Bus Shelter Replacement Programme, we have a new bus shelter on Main Street.



We are financially supporting two community groups in their endeavours to improve the village. Firstly, we are giving £250 to Wilberfoss in Bloom to replace the planter on Main Street in front of the Community Centre and secondly, we have committed £1,000 to Wilberfoss Playing Field Association in their bid to install outdoor gym equipment for community use. These funds will be held on account until the project has secured the remaining funds necessary. We wish the PFA well in their continued fundraising efforts.

We are still pursuing the idea of removing the laurel hedge at the War Memorial garden. It is likely that it will be carried out by the Community Payback Team but their efforts over the coming months will focus on grass cutting and village maintenance so the laurel hedge project will be delayed. The removal of the hedge will offer more space for those attending the Remembrance Sunday Service. If you have any observations to make, please get in touch with the Parish Clerk by email.

Thank you to Richard Rains and Ian Child for replacing the roof on the Bug Hotel in the amenity land. Spring has sprung and we hope the area will be used for recreation and to enjoy nature.

# WCYAP

The **GOOD** news is that our bid to East Riding County Council for a grant to run this programme was been successful and we were awarded just over £4,000. However, The **BAD** news is that, despite all all our efforts to recruit volunteers to be part of the core team and having got all the hard work completed of Constitution and 10 Policies, confirmed Specialist Activity Providers for the first 6 or 7 months of the Programme and got our shopping list of resources; we have NOT been successful in securing a volunteer band of local people to drive the initiative.

Ratio numbers of adults and young people are needed legally, as well as practically - and also to cover the range of functions needed by any Constituted Volunteer Community Group – ***and we were only asking for 3 committed individuals able to offer 4-5 hours per month.***

**For that reason, and with great regret, we have had to turn down the grant and give up on our vision for this local provision for the young people (aged 8-14) in and nearby our village.**

We are grateful to the schools for their promotion of this project, to local business donations to fund our work so far, including the December Taster Event, and to local skilled people who offered their services to run a specialist activity. Most importantly, we feel so disappointed that the enthusiastic response from young people themselves and the promise of exciting regular activities to help develop all their potential - will not now be realised. After many years without any local provision, our young people will still need to continue to travel into Pocklington - or miss out.

We tried, but it seems that it was not to be... However we will keep the concept of WCYAP alive with the small amount of funding we have left and will try to secure more from the Parish Council and raise sponsorship from local businesses, and try to put on 2 or 3 more major events throughout the year to bring young people together in our community.


