News in Brief

The Community Payback team is still working hard in the village. They've replaced more of the fencing on the amenity land, replaced the gate post on the gate leading to the A1079 on Back Lane, cleared leaf mulch and drains on Beckside to prevent flooding, strimmed the footpath on Ings Road and washed the bridge on Main Street. We are extremely grateful to the team for their support of our community. There's more work to come and the team will also be carrying out the grass cutting of public verges this season.

In last month's Newsletter we reported that we were planning to install a bus shelter at the western entrance to the village. This project will have to be delayed until we know exactly where the eastbound bus stop will be re-located to, following approval of the development of 70 new homes off Main Street. You'll find the full planning application under the News section of the Parish Council website.

Are you knowledgeable in Wilberfoss village history? Do you have old photos and stories you'd like to share? A historian filmmaker has approached the Parish Council with a possible village heritage project. Drop the Parish Clerk a line if you'd like to get involved.

As the new financial year approaches, the Parish Council will focus on the following projects for 2026/2027. At this stage we cannot guarantee completion, but our intentions are to:-

- ◆ Install more bollards on Beckside to further protect the verges.
- ◆ Fund the replacement of a planter for Wilberfoss in Bloom.
- ◆ Install of a bus shelter.
- ◆ Install kerbing on Beckside to prevent verge slip, flooding and potholing.
- ◆ Clean the cenotaph and remove the laurel hedge in the War Memorial garden to offer more room on Remembrance Sunday.

Fly-tipping has been reported to us on Mill Hill and on land off Storking Lane/Hawthorne Drive. Fly-tipping of any kind encourages vermin, and we would respectfully ask everyone to dispose of waste responsibly. We would like to take this opportunity to thank volunteer litter pickers and ask everyone to use the litter bins provided throughout the village.

September	Seasonal planting (spring/summer to autumn/winter), last meeting and gardening sessions of the year. Decide on spring/summer plant order.
October	Bingo night - great night and fundraiser, prizes and Chilli Supper
November	Re-group and recharge
December	Decorate the Village Christmas tree for the festive season

Staying active is about to get a whole lot easier (and more scenic!). Keep your eyes peeled for more updates as we secure the final funding to make this happen.




